Getting your stimulus check

If you are NOT a dependent and make under \$75,000, get \$1,200

\$500 per child (under 17)

If have direct deposit (filed tax returns in 2018 or 2019, SSDI) should have gotten.

Or go to https://www.irs.gov/coronavirus/non-filers-payment to sign up to receive direct deposit payment to your bank or by check.

Unemployment

- File ASAP (can take a long time to receive & starts at time you file, not time you stopped working)
- Fill out at the Department of Labor website of CA: https://www.edd.ca.gov/unemployment/
- Stimulus bill impact on unemployment:
 - Expansion of unemployment is additional 13 weeks to the CA max.
 - Added \$600 a week on top of your state unemployment amount.
 - Now also applies to gig workers, freelancers, self-employed and part-time workers.
 - If you previously used all your benefits, you can refile and the package extends benefits by 13 weeks for a maximum of 39 weeks.
 - Those under doctor-ordered quarantine, diagnosed with or caring for someone with COVID-19 and those who lost child care and had to leave work as a result can apply.
 - As for people with multiple streams of income who lose one or more of their jobs, it's worth applying for unemployment.
- CARE Act for COM Students
 - Fill out a FAFSA 2019-2020

Jobs in healthcare (providers and manufacturers):

Emergency services, diagnostics, pharmaceutical, medical supplies, personal protective equipment



Grocery, discount chains, online retailers, warehouses

- •Lower skill sets: E.g. audio transcription, customer service, data entry
- •Remote meeting companies like Zoom, Slack, and Microsoft Teams are hiring
- •Indeed.com

Be prepared for virtual interview

- •Space/location
- •Demeanor & Appearance
- •Eye contact/fidgeting
- •Do test run


Need internet?

- Poll shows steady push toward:
 - Moving internships online

 - Cutting back on the number of interns
 - Some summer internships are being revoked (70%)
