### **Pre-calculus and Calculus**

If you have not completed two years of high school algebra (including intermediate or advanced algebra), it is highly recommended that you enroll in a companion class regardless of your high school GPA.

## **GOOD NEWS**

With the AB 705 legislation, students are not required to take a test to enroll in math, English, or ESL classes at College of Marin. California Community Colleges use high school GPA and self-placement to help students select their math, English, and ESL classes (students taking ESL classes still have the option to take an ESL assessment test for placement).

This brochure is designed to help you understand the placement process and your math, English, and ESL class options. However, the best way to select the right class is to see a counselor. A counselor will help you determine the best choice for your individualized educational goal.
