Sarah, Tino

Alice- Every year we go to the UN club and represent college of Marin. We normally take 6 people to this. We have more members this year and we want to take 13 people and 9 people went last year. 2 of them have gotten awards. In this competition, we act as countries, and we're supposed to pass motions and pass laws. The college gets points. Last time we went, we got a certificate. Aline our treasurer sent our budget of where the \$7,000 are going, basically, we need a hotel which we're gonna stay in a motel. And we're gonna be driving there, because if we take a plane it's gonna be way too expensive. We are going to drive to Santa Barbara. So, what we did last year we were planning to do this here again, is to take 3 private cars. So, we need the gas money. That's what that part of the money is included. Food for everyone that is staying there for each day, and the hotel. We also know how much money we have. We took that into consideration and it's in the budget. We need more to bring 13 people with us.

Tshiamo- I want to clarify that we don't reimburse with gas, it's milage. You also mentioned that it's going to be the same people that went last year. Is it not possible to have new people got to the event? 7 thousand is a lot. It allows for your club to grow. In a sense, it's not only the same people going, but everybody else goes as well, and it would also be just more affordable as well, because I don't think we'll be able to fund, I'm not sure I don't speak to the whole board, but I find that 7,000 is a lot.

Alice- A lot of new people feel uncomfortable to go. College of Marin is the only community college to go. It is very intense. COM wants us to win. We want everyone to go, but not a lot of new people signed up. Even if they're comfortable, we are putting college of Marin at risk, if we base it on new people. We could cut down people, but it is a very big mistake to not have the people who want to go not go. We need to get invited, and we got invited to go again.

Tshiamo- I understand the experience of representing COM. It's also important to grow, not just as the name of College of Marin, but the students as well. This is what caters to the students, it's what helps students grow, it's for everyone. You know, it's not just for those who do know how to do it and win at the end, and I understand how important it is to have a representative there that knows what's going on. And I truthfully understand it. It is however you guys can cut it down, think about who you want to bring. We care about students' growth.

Tino- similar to Tshiamo, we also want other students to grow. And that's important part, of course, that's great that these students already have pre experience are going to bring us points. But we also want to take other students.

Alice- We do want other students to go. It's a hard position, but majority don't want to take this opportunity. We don't want to put ourselves in the position to not be invited again. We want to make sure that we are going to get invited again. So we unfortunately cannot put ourselves in a position where we are not gonna get invited again. Because that's basically why we're training. That's why we're practicing. We're practicing being on the conferences. And if we send 8 people that have no experiences, and they don't participate. Because that's not only the point system. It's not only about winning. It's about being there, and talking, like putting yourself out there. But no one's gonna make you put yourself out there. You need to go there and have the confidence. And we just can't put ourselves in a position where we're gonna send 8 people that we don't know if they're gonna have that confidence. We need to have some people that we know, and some people that that are there to learn, because again, we just can't put ourselves in this position, and not getting invited anymore. If you're not invited, we can do that. And that's why there's so many community colleges don't participate because they just don't get invited, and if we don't get invited, we can't participate.

Ryan- Lets talk financially about this. Jorge, what's your take on this?

Jorge- we have 28,500. We haven't spent a lot of money in there. I think it is something is worthwhile. It is good for college of Marin and it's well organized.

Tshiamo- Don't we have other PRs?

Jorge- Yeah, so maybe like 24 or 25 thousand.

Ryan- These students have the opportunity to do something new. I understand it is good for the college. We represent the college but we also represent the students. Given what Jorge said, I do think it is something we should consider.

Fatimah- I think it is a lot because we have this money for the whole year. It could be that we don't have to pay for food or gas.

Aaliyah- Maybe we can cut down on the people. 8 Students

Alice- We could, but the less students, less points. If that's the only option then sure. Last time we went to Santa Barbara we did so good that we got invited to another item.

Motion to extend the time: Tshiamo, Sabrina

Tino- I was wondering if it's possible to cut food pay out of this.

Alice- It's the kind of thing where, if I tell them that COM is not going to pay, we're gonna have at least two thirds leaving, because unfortunately, these students, they can't afford going to these conferences, like I myself like, if I wanna go to that conference and I think I'm gonna do well, I just can't put all this money into this conference, although I would

love to. Last year, We actually sat with the students that we went, because we took a very small amount of students conference, and all of them were going to be gone. So it's really sad. But with all the guests and the the money, the food money, the students can't afford to go.

Ryan- You guys took a smaller delegation, but you still won.

Alice- Yes, but we had less people in the club. Like I said, if it is absolutely necessary for us to take less people, we can. But then it goes back to we're not really representing college. And then we go back to, we are but not as much as we could. And then it goes back to, we can only take 5 people, and then out of those 5 people, how many are going to be students that don't have any experience and are gonna push us back, because then we don't want to put only students that have experience.

Giovanni- How many people have experience?

Alice- Generally from going, we have six people. We might not even take all of them. It's not about winning. It's about the number of points. So, we have plenty out of all these students, all of them won enough points to be a big deal.

Giovanni- half of the people have experience and the other half don't.

Saidy- This whole discussion we can't seem to find a middle ground. We're running out of time.

Ryan- we can amend the time one more time.

Motion to extend time: Jorge, Sabrina

Tshiamo- you discusses that having many students allow you to go to many committees. But it's not about winning, but you say it's important to win.

Alice- How it works is winning means getting the college a big amount of points. But there's 2 ways you can do that. You can do that through being outstanding and get a certificate which is technically winning. So the person that is on the Committee did so good that they were outstanding, and they got a prize themselves. So that's what I'm referring to winning, so that we have 2 students. They got certificates because they did so, outstanding that they were. You know they were nominated for that. But when you are in a committee. There's a bunch of things that you got done, and all those things keep adding points to each different students. So, for example, when we're writing the paper. If you're just sitting there like talking, you're not gonna get any points. But if you're writing, you're gonna get points and all those points at the end they're for the college. So I might not get a certificate. But all the points that I did, they're gonna go towards the college.

Tshiamo- what's the difference between 8 students in 8 different committees and having them add total points to those 8 different committees. Then, having 13 students that what. I don't even know how to word it.

Alice- Because we're individuals. There's actually, I think around 9 committee committees. So there's a lot of committees. So even we have one student each. That's a very small chance. Colleges usually they send a huge group of students. So if we have 2 students there, If one students not doing anything that student is not getting points, even if you both are doing, each one are getting separate points, because it's the person that gets, and at the end of that those points are towards college of marin. So it's me and Gabby, which is the president. We're in the same committee. But if Gabby is doing okay. I'm doing really good. The points that Gabby gets and the points that I get at the end of gonna get summed for everyone. So the more students you have, the more points you get, the better it is for college of marin.

Tshiamo- Okay, but you have nine committees. You can have nine students.

Alice- we can't. Committees have different levels. We need specific committees for specific knowledge and experience.

Tshiamo- How many committees have you been invited to? How many of them do yiu have knowledge in?

Alice- we can do all of them. We have 2 or 3 committees that are really hard. There are also huge committees.

Motion to amend extra time: Tshiamo, Tino

Alice- So basically, the other ones, they're huge. So you have like a room with 150 to 200 students. It's huge. And those students, there's multiple students from different colleges. And all those students are getting points. So when you say that makes no difference, it absolutely makes difference to have 8 or 13, because those 13 are making way more points than 8. And only 8 students are not gonna make as much as 13. So yeah, we can make, we can bring less people. But what we need to take into consideration is that the final result is not going to be the same.

Ryan- the more students you bring, the more points you can win. However, 7,450 is a lot of money. We have a lot of students that will be asking for money.

Aaliyah- I think eight is pretty practical.

Tshiamo- I think nine plus a faculty. One per committee.

Gavi- as far as price goes, you are dealing with a lot of the price in the hotel rooms. You can do three hotel rooms and three students each. You can knock about 1,500 off.

Ryan- who's your faculty?

Alice- Paul.

Sadika- Paul can request funds elsewhere.

Ryan- we should cut down to nine students, Paul can request for funds elsewhere. You have two more meetings to request funds.
