- I. New Business (Actions May Be Taken)
 - a. Discussion on Caring Campus presentation. Discussion by Alyssa Graff.

Motion: Lara, Kaveh

Isabel: Caring Campus is an initiative led by classified staff. We work in classified positions.

Briar: So non management, non admin, and non faculty positions.

Isabel: So the initiative is us promoting and reinforcing a campus culture centered in student success, basically we aim to foster a welcoming environment and connectedness for students. So stuff we have already been doing. Based on the evidence based change institution, it has positive effects on student success. So it makes interactions relational and non transactional. We want to institutionalize this and do training. So not just stuff that some people are doing.

Briar: This is behavior that people are already doing, but we want to document, institutionalize them in a clear way. And these are the 5 methods we came up with.

Lupita: So this is pretty similar to what it sounds like. When you see someone walking around say hello. make the environment friendly. Especially at the start of the semester. Asking if they need support. The hope is to make people feel more welcome and less stressed out. Also warm referrals. At the welcome center, it's like sending a phone call asking for resources, just so that they are connected and the student feels supported. Or walking them there, or giving them a map. Any way that we can connect students with other departments. That makes it easier for people to navigate the campus. Greetings, in the week we usually try to have resources and events and tabling so students can learn the campus. We have resource fairs, and club fests and stuff that help students. We try to make it fun and interactive.

Briar: These are some examples. (name tags and identifications) We have a lot of students with different ages. So names and ID is what we came up with to help people identify. So when people are looking around they can easily identify people who can help. We have stuff in production as to what the name tags could look like. Or like even a shirt that helps identify staff members. Cross department awareness is a behavioral commitment. It's a bit different, it's kind of odd because it's like when you come up as a student and you don't know how to enroll in classes, I'd help connect you with people who can help even if I don't have the capacity to help you. So referring people to the transfer center, referring people to counselors, making the access easier for students.

Isabel: So at bigger colleges we'd have an international office or other specialists, so Brier has to work with other people a lot to help people properly.

Brier: So not all departments do that. Some departments aren't trained on where to refer students. So it's really helping staff to train them and help them collaborate. So that's just a little bit about what that looks like. We're here to get your opinion on this stuff. How do students want to be involved? How can staff make COM a more welcoming environment?

Emilia: These ideas kind of popped up but as a student when you come here it's uncomfortable to reach out. Most of the activities I did were recommended by students. One example is that I work in the tutoring center. I introduce myself in classes and I feel that people feel more comfortable reaching out to me since I'm a student. So having student tutors reach out and introduce themselves can make it easier for people to get these resources.

Briar: So maybe having a student rep or like a student trustee. Like having a table with students out that people feel comfortable talking to

Emelia: Yeah, so students are definitely a lot more approachable.

Ryli: Yea, I was just thinking how bigger courses work at bigger university they get people involved with like welcome week and advertising organization, they also have student ambassadors who are paid being a really big resource upfront for students. Having them on like the bridges, in the AC quad, etc. Having student ambassadors fill that role and providing paid positions could increase interest. We need to extend time again.

Lara: Sure

Emily: I'll be the student trustee this fall. I'd love to keep in contact. I'd love to share what has made my exp here so amazing.

Briar: Yeah that's a great idea. So anything specifically for the staff? Like people who work in this office, what could we be doing?

Briar: Feel free to reach out, we are definitely open to continue this convo.

Ryi: Anything else?

Emily: Read my chat

Ryli: Ah yes, having donuts, breakfast and stuff to bring people in.

Emily: People feel more comfortable. They feel awkward when they don't know what to do at an event.

Briar: So having an informal chat.

Emily: Yeah like it's my job to talk to you. People don't want to be a burden but it is our job to communicate.

Briar: That's right.

Ryli: We are short on time. Thanks guys!
