College of Marin Local General Education Information

College of Marin's local general education pattern meets the general education requirements for an associate degree in arts or sciences. **Please note that this general education pattern does NOT meet the requirements for the Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT).** For ADTs, you must complete IGETC or CSU GE Breadth. *Make sure to meet with a counselor to determine if COM's GE aligns with your educational goals.*

Graduation Requirements

The Associates in Arts (A.A.) degree or Associate in Science (A.S.) degree will be awarded to any student upon satisfactory completion of the following:

Units: The Associate in Arts (A.A.) degree and the Associate in Science (A.S.) degree require a minimum of 60 lower division units to include all the requirements indicated below and any additional elective units needed to satisfy the 60-unit minimum. Courses numbered 0-99 are not applicable to the Associate degree

Major Requirement: At least 18 units of study must be taken in a single discipline or related disciplines as indicated in the College of Marin Catalog. All major units may double-count for COM GE.

General Education: Students must complete one of the following general education patterns:

- COM's Local GE pattern (see reverse side of this document)
- CSU GE Breath
- Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC)

Scholarship: An overall grade point average (G.P.A.) of 2.0 ("C" average) in all degree applicable courses (numbered 100 and above) taken at College of Marin and in all acceptable lower division courses transferred from other colleges.

Residence: Complete at least 12 units completed at College of Marin.

Mathematics Proficiency: Effective Fall 2019 with the implementation of AB 705, students may meet the math competency requirement in one of the following ways:

- Complete Intermediate Algebra or higher with a grade of "C" or higher.
- Pass a math competency test (please consult the math department for more information).
- High School GPA of 3.5 or higher and passed a high school precalculus course with a "C" or higher.
- Pass the Advanced Placement test in Calculus AB, Calculus BC or Statistics with a score of 3 or higher.

Application for Graduation: It is the student's responsibility to submit an "Application for Graduation" by making an appointment with a counselor in the Counseling Department. All official transcripts from other colleges must be available in the Counseling Office by the application deadline date. All petitions and waivers must be attached to the application form by the deadline date. (See Class Schedule or the College Catalog for those dates.)

Awarding a Degree or Certificate of Achievement: Upon completion of all degree requirements as specified in the catalog, a student may qualify for more than one degree or certificate.

Catalog Rights: The catalog sets forth graduation requirements for achieving an Associate degree, and these requirements may change from one catalog to the next. Catalog rights are established for any semester that a student is in attendance. The specific catalog employed toward graduation requirements and all implied rights cease after two consecutive semesters of nonattendance. State of California and federal law, as well as College of Marin Board policy, shall take precedence over catalog rights. Students not enrolled when applying for an Associate Degree or Certificate of Achievement and who have maintained their catalog rights may use that catalog or any subsequent catalog, up to and including the current catalog
