IGETC General Education Transfer Information for UC and CSU

The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) is a 37- unit general education pattern which allows California Community College students to fulfill lower-division general education (GE) requirements for either the CSU or UC system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division GE requirements. *Please note that not all departments at the UCs accept IGETC. Make sure to meet with a counselor to determine if IGETC aligns with your educational goals.*

IGETC CERTIFICATION

IGETC Certification is not a requirement for admission to most UC and CSU, nor is it the only way to fulfill the lower-division general education requirements. Please consult a counselor for the specific lower-division requirements for your educational goals.

Full IGETC Certification refers to an official notification from a community college that a transfer student has completed the lower-division General Education requirements for UC or CSU bachelor's degree program. **Full Certification** is given to students who have completed all areas of the General Education Pattern outlined on the reverse side of this document with a "C" or better.

Partial Certification is defined as completing all but two courses on the IGETC pattern. Partial certification must be accompanied by a separate IGETC form that indicates which requirements remain to be completed. Please request IGETC certification from the last community college you attend prior to transfer when requesting the last transcript from College of Marin.

Students can also apply for a **Certificate of Achievement: IGETC General Education**. See a counselor for details and application process.

UC TRANSFER INFORMATION

In the UC system, some majors do not accept the IGETC as complete fulfillment of the lower-division general education breadth. To be eligible for transfer as an **Upper-Division** transfer student to the UC system, students must complete 60 UC-transferable units with a 2.4 GPA and meet the 7-course breadth pattern below.

"7-Course Pattern" Requirement

Students must complete:

- Two UC-English courses
- One UC-Mathematics & Quantitative Reasoning course
- Four transferable courses from the following areas:
 - Arts & Humanities
 - Social & Behavioral Sciences
 - Physical & Biological Sciences

CSU TRANSFER INFORMATION

IGETC is not required for all majors at the CSU system. To be considered an **Upper-Division** transfer student, students must complete 60 CSU-transferable units with a 2.0 GPA and the "Golden Four" below. A maximum of 70 lower division units may be transferred.

"Golden Four" Requirement

Areas 1A, 1B, 1C, and 2 are considered the "Golden Four" and must be completed with grades of "C" or higher. Note: high unit programs (e.g., Engineering) may not require Area 1B Critical Thinking prior to transfer.

US History, Constitution and American Ideals

All CSU campuses require a U.S. History and an American Government course for graduation. This requirement may be met prior to transfer but does not impact certification of general education.
