### 1 Application



#### **Apply to College of Marin**

Go to [www1.marin.edu/apply](http://www1.marin.edu/apply) and choose **Apply For Credit Classes**. Create a CCC account then start the College of Marin application. Be sure to have an active email account you can access.

#### **Portal Setup**

Check your email for the MyCOM welcome letter then go to [mycom.marin.edu](http://mycom.marin.edu) and choose **First Time Users** to set up your portal.

# 2 Counseling and Orientation

## Counseling and Orientation

Students who are not currently in high school should complete the online orientation and schedule an appointment with an academic counselor to create or update an education plan.
